- 2. If you have a credit or gift certificate that you want to apply to your registration, you must enroll via phone. You cannot apply them through online registration.

Student Drop/Withdrawal Policy

You will receive full Drawing Studio credit or a refund if a class is cancelled, or if you withdraw two or more weeks in advance of the class start date. Students withdrawing between two weeks and 24 hours of the class start date may request a 50% refund or full Drawing Studio credit. No refund or credit will be given once a class begins. Class credits are valid for 1 year.

Class Cancellation Policy

Classes may be cancelled 72 hours before the first class if it does not meet the minimum enrollment. If this happens, we will issue a full refund or Drawing Studio credit. All refunds are sent via check to the student's address on file. Please allow up to 14 business days for your refund.

Drawing Fundamentals

THE FOUNDATIONAL COURSE SEQUENCE OF THE DRAWING STUDIO

Both universal and intimate, drawing is the backbone of visual art. Since our earliest days, drawing has been a powerful tool to explore what it is to be alive and human.

Anyone CAN learn to draw. And, like any skill worth acquiring, drawing is an ongoing discipline that continually presents challenges. Drawing Fundamentals provides a supportive and encouraging learning environment that immerses you in the practice of drawing from observation. Guided by experienced teaching artists and inspired by your peers, you will see the world in new ways, persist through difficulty, and expand your creative expression in art and in life. Drawing Fundamentals is structured as a sequence of two 6–week courses—Drawing Fundamentals 1 and 2—followed by a wide range of 3–week drawing practice modules from which you can pick and choose. Drawing Fundamentals introduces a curriculum of foundational skills that progressively deepens your practice. The sequence is designed for beginners with no experience as well as those with an art background who want to revisit and expand their practice. We offer multiple sections of each course at various times and locations throughout the year.

Drawing is a means to other artistic ends as well as its own rich domain. Whatever your goal or intention, Drawing Fundamentals will initiate you into a practice that can serve you for a lifetime.

Drawing Fundamentals, Level 1 (DF.1)

In DF1, students learn four foundational drawing skills: shape/edge, measurement, light (value) and space (perspective). You will begin to combine these skills into drawings that will surprise you by their accomplishment and banish any fears regarding your ability to observe and draw.

Fee: \$195 (6 sessions) Students who have paid the full tuition and completed level 1 may repeat level 1 at half price. Please call to register and apply this discount.

Begin to develop a personal vision that expands your experience of "observation" to encompass both internal and external realms.

DF3: Experimental Drawing

A staple of classical drawing through the ages, ink is now experiencing a resurgence in contemporary art. Try different techniques and types of ink. **Fee: each section, \$125 (3 sessions)**

DF3: Charcoal Explorations

LYNN FLEISCHMAN

Wednesday afternoons, 1 – 4 pm

February 27 – March 13

Charcoal is a powerful yet forgiving tool to explore value and composition, and this class delves deeply into both. We will experiment with point of view, abstraction and representation, and ways to bring your whole body (rather than just your hand and eye) into drawing. **Fee: \$125 (3 sessions)**

DF3: Cut Paper

ANDREW RUSH

Thursday evenings, 5:30 – 8:30 pm March 14 – March 28

The most valuable foundation underlying memorable visual art is the pattern of dark and light that the eye first sees, long before it sorts out everything else (like color, subject, meaning). Borrowing from my printmaking practice, I have developed some simple exercises working and playing with black/white construction paper to master the skills that produce strong compositions in every, and any, art media. **Fee: \$125 (3 sessions)**

DF3: Portrait of the Tree (on-site / Drawing Studio)

ANDREA MENDOLA

Wednesday afternoons, 1:30 – 4:30 pm April 3 – April 17

We feel a connection to trees, perhaps more than any other plant. Discover what makes each tree individual, while continuing your own growth as an artist. Gain deeper understanding of the structure and nature of your subject, while interpreting its unique character through increased awareness of mark–making, shape, and value. We will work in the field using charcoal and graphite. **Fee: \$125 (3 sessions)**

Open Figure Studio

Since the very first day of The Drawing Studio, Open Figure Studio has been the place to hone our practice and enjoy the fellowship of a community of like-minded drawers, painters, and (occasionally) sculptors. The word "abstraction" is often misunderstood in art studies as distinct from subject matter, narrative or illustrative art. Yet a grasp of the nature of abstraction is essential to mastery of any way of art-making. In this seminar we will a) look at many examples of abstraction in practice; b) discuss the role of abstraction as a workable aspect of any successful art image; c) spend at least half the day working with our own subjects and style from the point of view of abstraction-in-action. **Fee: \$90**

Recording the Natural World – Artist as Scientist as Artist

Wednesday mornings, 9 am – 12 pm February 27 – March 13 Using graphite, watercolor and ink, measure and explore the natural world through the tradition of field studies. Instructor provides found natural objects from the forest, sea and desert gardens. Brush up on your skills with these combined media. **Fee: \$125 (3 sessions)**

Perspective

Wednesday afternoons, 1 – 4 pm February 27 – March 6

To create the illusion of depth in a drawing we must transfer visual info from a 3-dimensional world onto a 2-dimensional surface. In this workshop you will grasp an understanding of how perspective works to do just that. With some tips, observation and exercises, you will start to produce drawings that jump off the page! **Fee: \$90 (2 sessions)**

The Pen Tool is Not a Pen BARRY DODGE

Thursday evenings, 6 – 8:30 pm March 14 – March 28

Many drawing applications have a pen tool that is used to define shapes or selections using a series of Bézier curves. We will use the iPad version of Affinity Designer (available in the App store for approximately \$20) to learn how to create and control Bézier curves. You will create curves and shapes, and apply color, gradients, and transparencies to the shapes to compose images. The skills developed in this class can be applied to other Affinity products as well as Adobe applications such as Photoshop and Illustrator. **Fee: \$125 (3 sessions)**

Experimental Drawing II DEB STEINBERG

Tuesday mornings, 9 am – 12 pm March 19 – April 2

There is more to the art of drawing than strictly rendering what you see. A big part of what we do as artists is interpret and experiment. Unleash your imagination, try new media and have fun developing new types of imagery. A great follow–up class for those who have taken DF3: Experimental Drawing, but you do not have to have taken it to enroll in this class. **Fee: \$125 (3 sessions)**

Introduction to Abstraction

DEB STEINBERG

Tuesday afternoons, 1 – 4 pm

April 9 – April 30

Whether you work representationally or abstractly, learning how to think abstractly will greatly improve your artwork. Class projects involve the meaningful use of values, forms, color and line to create space and balance in abstract compositions. Students may use medium of their choice. This class is perfect for drawing and painting students interested in exploring or pursuing abstraction. **Fee: \$150 (4 sessions)**

Exploring Your Voice through Narrative Art

CARRIE ROBLES

Tuesday evenings, 5:30 – 8:30 pm April 9 – April 30

Art is so much more than just creating pretty pictures; it's a universal language of communication. What do you wish to say? You'll be taken on an exploration to hone in on your own artistic voice and vision, learn strategies for creating a composition and scene that conveys your unique story, and work on the creation of a narrative painting(s) or drawing(s). Open to drawing or painting medium of your choice. **Fee: \$150 (4 sessions)**

The Studio Art Workshop CARRIE ROBLES

Wednesday evenings, 5:30 – 8:30 pm

April 10 – May 1

Strengthen your art making practice by exploring your own ideas in conjunction with the technical guidance of your instructor. Besides individual help with various techniques, this class will include the principles of picture making that will help you take your work to the next level, including such topics as composition and design. Open to 2D media of your choice. **Fee: \$150 (4 sessions)**

Words & Images

ANDREW RUSH

Thursday evenings, 5:30 – 8:30 pm January 17 – February 21

In the cracks of art history are artists like Beatrix Potter, William Blake, Ben Shahn, Saul Steinberg, Edward Gorey and many others whose art explores the relationship between visual and verbal languages and communicates outside the gallery model of "art for walls". This course will include weekly short projects to develop the skills of simultaneous visual/verbal thinking. Students will invent and carry out their own 'word/image' project, with coaching in designing a do– able idea, from concept to finished work. Prerequisite: Drawing Fundamentals 1 & 2 or equivalent. **Fee: \$195 (6 sessions)**

Pastel/Colored Pencil

Introduction to Illustration (CACC) SUSAN SIMON

Wednesday afternoons, 1 – 4 pm February 6 – February 27

We artists constantly look carefully at the world around us in order to understand what we are drawing. The comprehension we gain enables us to draw not only what we see, but also what we imagine. Illustration is the art of creating images with a message and taking charge of their clarity and power. This class will set your thoughts and your imagination on fire while deepening your drawing and thinking skills. We will focus on imagination, clarity, emotional content, and the use of a sketchbook as a planning and learning tool. All levels welcome including those who have specific ideas or ongoing projects **Fee: \$150 (4 sessions)**



Color Fundamentals – Colored Pencil DEB STEINBERG

Once you feel comfortable with basic drawing skills (DF1 and 2, or equivalent), it may be time to move into the fascinating realm of color. This class presents a step-by-step introduction to working in colored pencil, including layering and the effective use of color. Fee: \$195 (6 sessions)

Intro to Pastel: Representational Techniques

With DF1 and 2 experiences in drawing from direct observation, you may have a yen to venture into the luscious color world of dry pastel. Topics include pastel and paper types, color mixing, layering to create the right color, using value and color to create form and depth, and strategies for creating realistic subject matter. **Fee: \$150 (4 sessions)**

Portrait Painting in Pastel

B. Tuesday evenings, 5:30 – 8:30 pm February 12 – March 5

We will work from reference and life to learn the soft pastel and pastel pencil techniques necessary to create colorful and realistic portraits. Topics include drawing features, proportions, and characteristics of various parts of the face, design and edge, hair, backgrounds, and a look at the subtleties that bring your work to life. **Fee: \$180 (4 sessions, includes model fees)**

Working with Color in Colored Pencil

Thursday mornings, 9 am – 12 pm March 21 – April 25

Discover the emotional power of color and how to control it to enhance the mood and impact of your artwork. Learn the basics of color theory and how to mix and match colors accurately, and begin to develop an individual and personal color palette. Try It! Desert Blooms in Watercolor ADELA ANTOINETTE

How can something so beautiful grow from something so dangerous if encountered too closely? We'll explore in watercolor the flowers of different cacti ranging from cholla to prickly pear and more!

Try It! Art and Ecology SARAIYA KANNING

March 30 • Saturday morning, 9 am – 12 pm In this single day exploration, we'll learn about a few Sonoran Desert plant and animal species and how they are (or could be) affected by current environmental issues.
